

On May 24, 2010 at approximately 1430 hours patrol cars responded to a house on King St., a thickly settled area in Littleton for a past breaking and entering. The thieves attempted to get into the rear slider and also attempted to get into the bulkhead door. They damaged both of these entrance points but were not able to get inside. When this failed they used some type of tool to smash out the nine light windows on the driveway side of the house. Upon entering the house they were able to steal various electronic items and jewelry.

This is the Fifth house break that we have responded to since April 20, 2010. The house breaks are very common and appear that they may be linked to each other. They attempt or are successful in going through an open sliding door or window. If that does not happen they will try and force their way inside. Once they get inside they are taking quick items that are easy to pawn or even trade for drugs. i.e.: laptops, flat screens, gaming systems, cash, jewelry, coins... The locations vary from rural cul-de-sac neighborhoods to very busy main roads.

The Littleton Police Department is asking for your help in solving these crimes. We are asking you to be aware of your surroundings. Keep a watchful eye on suspicious activity. If you see a person or vehicle that is out of the ordinary in your neighborhood write down the license plate or call the police department. Lock your doors to your house and garage, don't make it easy for these criminals to walk in and take your belongings.
