*RENEWAL OF REGULATION 18: NON-MUNICIPALLY
OWNED SEWAGE TREATMENT FACILITIES*

LEGAL NOTICE

At a public hearing held on June 24, 2002 in Room 103 at 8:00 p.m. at the Littleton Town Offices Building at 37 Shattuck Street, the Littleton Board of Health voted to renew the following regulation: **Effective on the date of these regulations, the Littleton Board of Health will not accept applications for testing, or accept plans for review, or issue applications for permits for non-municipally owned sewage collection, treatment, or disposal systems to serve two or more lots until July 7, 2003 in order to permit orderly development and implementation of reasonable standards and procedures to govern these facilities, which will protect the long term public health. These standards and procedures will be developed to insure protection of public health through the proper specification and evaluation of siting criteria, through the demonstration of the feasibility of long term operation and maintenance planning, through the development of contractual mechanisms that insure timely replacement of failed and outdated equipment and through the clear assignment of responsibility for nuisance, public health, or pollution impacts of the proposed facility. Exceptions to this regulation are to include upgrades to existing non-municipally owned sewage treatment plants approved by the Board of Health.**
