ACTON— Donald R. Burns, 72, died Monday, Oct. 2, at Emerson Hospital in Concord. He was the husband of Ethel (Cady) Burns, whom he married in 1948.



He was born in New Bedford on Dec.

14, 1927, a son of the late James and Louise (Cayott) Burns. He grew up in New Bedford and attended the local schools, and was later graduated from Cheshire Academy in Connecticut.

Mr. Burns joined the Navy to serve in World War II when he was 17. After the war he worked on fishing boats in New Bedford and later at Electric Boat in New London, Conn.

He worked for Cabot Corp. in Cambridge for 15 years, then went into auto repair. He was part owner of the School Street Garage in Acton, Exxon in Lexington, and most recently in West Acton, where he owned and ran the Frosty Corners service station and ice cream shop.

Besides his wife, survivors include two sons, Robert Burns of Littleton and Gary Burns of Tigard, Ore.; two daughters, Donna Taggart of Andover and Sharon Stuckart of Templeton; and four grandchildren, Tamazine and Elizabeth Taggart, Christine Stuckart and Matthew Burns.
