## Genevieve Duffy... Littleton, served as nurse for town, schools, in WWII; 83

LITTLETON — Genevieve (Findle) Duffy, 83, a longtime Littleton resident whose long career in nursing included service in World War II as well as being the school and town nurse for Littleton, died yesterday, May 5, at Life Care Center of Nashoba Valley in Littleton. She was the wife of John L. Duffy, who died in 2001.

She was born in Irwin, Pa., on Sept. 2, 1920, a daughter of the late Frank and Mary (Flick) Findle. She grew up on Irwin and graduated from Irwin High School. She later graduated from nursing school.

During World War II, Mrs. Duffy served as lieutenant in the U.S. Army Nurse Corps in England and Germany.

Following the war and her marriage, she

worked as a nurse in local hospitals. She later worked as the Littleton school nurse and town nurse.

She was fondly known to many friends simply as "Duffy" and was a volunteer for the town of Littleton Salvation Army Committee. She was also a member of the St. Anne's Church in Littleton. Mrs. Duffy also enjoyed playing golf as a member of the Nabnasset Lake Country Club in Westford.

She is survived by a niece, Judy Martin, who resides in Ohio; a great-nephew, Joseph Killmeyer, residing in Michigan; and a great-niece, Joyce Thomas, in Ohio. She also leaves her special friends and caregivers, Theresa, John and Alicia Blanchard of Littleton.

She was also the sister of the late Francis Findle and Dorothy McNallen.
