LITTLETON- John E. Gray, 77, a longtime Littleton resident, died unexpectedly Sunday, June 20, at his home. He was the husband of

He was born on Feb. 13, 1922, son of the late Russell and Florence (Shaw) Gray. He spent his early childhood in Melrose and Malden and was a graduate of Malden High School.

Mr. Gray worked as a contractor in his window business for several years and then he entered the Army during World War II. He served in the Central European and Rhineland campaigns.

The Grays married in 1941 and moved to Littleton in 1959. Mr. Gray worked as a machinist for Gen Rad for over 25 years before retiring in 1984.

He was a past commander of the VFW Post #6556 and a member of the Harvard Rod and Gun Club.
