Ernest W. Lund Sr.

...of Littleton, repaired WWII aircraft; 79

LITTLETON — Ernest W. Lund Sr., 79, of Littleton, died Monday, May 1, at the Life Care Center of Nashoba Valley, where he resided for the past 16



months. He was the husband of Betty (Lawhorn) Lund, who died in 1997.

He was born in Littleton on Jan. 13, 1921, a son of the late John and Agnes (Duffy) Lund. He had attended the Shattuck Street School in Littleton and graduated in 1936.

Mr. Lund began working at the Abbot Worsted Mill in 1940, in the Forge Village section of Westford. In 1942, he worked for the town of Littleton in its highway maintenance department.

Later in 1942, Mr. Lund joined the Army where he repaired radio equipment in various types of aircraft. He served overseas during World War II for 22 months with the Army Air Forces in England and France and earned the rank of corporal. Mr. Lund later worked for Simond Saw in Fitchburg, Woodco Corp. in Lowell, and GCA of Andover for 20 years. He retired in 1983.

He was a member of St. Anne's Church and the Littleton VFW Post No. 6556.

He is survived by three children, Ernest W. Lund Jr. of Townsend, Edward L. and his wife Marie Lund of Littleton, Sandra and her husband Robert Philbrick of Leominster; five grandchildren, Allen Gosse in Texas, Wendy Gosse of Newton, Katie Philbrick of Leominster, Hillary Cole of Franklin, and John Keiser in Florida; three brothers, Edward J. Lund of Littleton, Richard Lund of Leominster, and Herb Lund in Pennsylvania.

He was also the brother of the late William and Jack Lund.
