From the Director

November 2, Town Meeting, 7:00 pm, Middle School on Russell Street

Join us at the Special Town meeting this month. Of particular interest to seniors is a warrant item that creates a special fund to collect donations to be used to defray the property taxes of low-income seniors and the disabled in Littleton. This is the Aid to Elderly and Disabled Taxation Fund. Applicants will be screened to determine need.

Reminder: there is now special parking at the front of the lot for seniors and the disabled and extra seating on the floor level, as well as a portable microphone for those who wish to speak. If you need a ride to the Town Meeting, contact Dispatch at **978-844-6809** to arrange van service.

November is National Caregivers Month

One of the big surprises from our Needs Assessment involved caregivers and caregiving in Littleton. We knew we had residents caring for adults in the home, however the Assessment gave us an idea of how many families are handling this situation.

In the age category of 50 – 59, **49% answered “yes”** when asked if they have provided care within the past 5 years to someone who is disabled or frail. And of this group, **79% reported the experience as “very” or “somewhat” challenging**. When we look at older residents (60+), the percent caring for someone is a bit less (40%), but 69% report that they find it very or somewhat challenging as well.

The Assessment also gave us insight into why care is needed: chronic illnesses, Alzheimer’s or other dementia, post-surgery care and others such as mobility problems, frailty, end-of-life care, blindness and post-accident care.

Among the services available for caregivers, their families, and the people for whom they provide care are our monthly Caregivers Support Group, the Littleton Social Club (which now meets 3 times a week), and a wide variety of other services including Friendly Visits and Meals on Wheels. We urge Caregivers to reach out and get help before you become too tired and stressed to help others effectively.



- Transportation requests must be scheduled at least 48 hours in advance. Call as soon as you schedule your appointment. Please call **978-844-6809** to schedule your ride. We will do our best to accommodate same-day **Emergency** medical appointments.
- When scheduling your appointment, you must have the exact street, number and town of where you are going, as well as any information on when you will be finished with your appointment. **Give the dispatcher a telephone number for your destination.**
- Be ready at least one half-hour before your pick-up time and expect to wait at least one half hour for your pickup. **Time for appointments must be between 9:00 am and return to Littleton by 3:00 pm**
- In order to serve you better, when making a reservation for transportation, please **Do Not** leave your requests on the answering machine, just your name and number.
- If your ride back is cancelled, please call the **Dispatcher at 978-844-6809**, or you will be charged for a full day.

- *If you have someone accompany you on the ride, they also will have to pay, except for vets.*
- *Due to the increase in volume of rides, it is possible that you will have to be picked up earlier than your requested pick-up time for your appointment or that you will have to wait on your return trip. All efforts are being made to accommodate everyone.*
