DEATHS.—George W. son of Charles P. Hartwell, died last Saturday noon. He received his death blow at his mill near the depot, four weeks before, by the bursting of a pulley, a piece of the casting striking him on the forehead. He had lingered so long that hopes were entertained of his ultimate recovery, but he began to grow very much worse about a week before he died. He was a great sufferer, till death came to his relief. From a child he had been sorely afflicted with the asthma, never finding any help for it. He was a person of uncommon ingenuity and ability, and the main-stay of his father's household, where he will be sadly missed. He was modest and retiring in his ways, and was a favorite with all, as was proved by his large funeral. Rev. Cloues officiated in a very impressive and sympathetic manner. The floral tributes from his brothers, Sunday school class, and other friends, were beautiful and appropriate. He was 37 years and 10 months old.
