Water Resources: conserve land in Beaver Brook watershed; support LWD aquifer and water quality protection efforts; support and promote lakes restoration efforts



Rt 2A / 119 Corridor: conserve agricultural lands; develop "scenic roads" by-law; protect "gateways" to Littleton; permanently protect Littleton Common greens



Land Protection: conserve large undeveloped parcels and agricultural lands through fee or restriction acquisition; educate landowners about conservation restrictions and agricultural preservation restrictions



Unique & Important Natural Area: acquire lands that expand natural area and create linkages to other protected lands; revitalize and support tri-town conservation program



Town Governance: coordinate efforts between appropriate departments and committees to advance OS&RP goals and objectives, such as improved stewardship of existing lands, and development of recommended by-laws



Recreation Facilities: improve and develop recreation programs and facilities; such as town track, wheelchair access, interpretive signage, benches and picnic tables, and youth environmental education



Partnerships & Alternative Funding: explore and develop partnerships and grant opportunities with state agencies, private organizations and companies, such as Mass DCS, Sudbury Valley Trustees, and IBM
