First gas inspector

Andrew Lovelace, 77, of Littleton, died at Emerson Hospital in Concord, on Sunday, March 15, 1998.

Mr. Lovelace served as Littleton's first gas inspector for 21 years and had lived in Littleton for 52 years. He was a charter member of the Littleton V.F.W. post #6556 and a charter member of the Littleton Lions Club. He was a avid sportsman and fisherman and was a member of the Shirley Rod and Gun Club.

He was born in Boxborough on Oct. 12, 1920, the son of the late Zenas and Christina (Levey) Lovelace. He spent his early life in Boxborough and attended the Acton school system. Mr. Lovelace graduated from the Lowell Technical School as a master plumber, and owned and operated Littleton Plumbing and Heating for many years. He served in the U.S. Army during World War II and was awarded a Purple Heart.

His survivors include his wife of 55 years, Mary (Bellevue) Lovelace of Littleton; two sons, Robert B. and his wife Mary (Cannava) Lovelace of Shirley, and Dan A. Lovelace of Vermont; and a brother, George H. Lovelace of Lancaster.
