Thaddeus "Ted" Lewis, 64, of 14 Williams Street, Ayer, died Michigan on October 2. He was born in Berlin, Germany on July 2, 1937 and was adopted and naturalized as an American Citizen in Baltimore, Maryland in 1939. Ted grew up in multiple locations along the East Coast, but identified with the times he lived in New York City and Great Neck, New York.. He received his BS in Electrical Engineering from M.I.T. and his Masters Degree in Computer Science from Northeastern University. Mr. Lewis worked as a computer programmer for several companies in the Boston area including Honeywell, Sylvania, Microbit and Control Data. He was disabled in the mid 1980's .

Ted had lived in several Boston suburbs including Lexington , Waltham, Littleton and most recently Ayer. He enjoyed folk music and dancing, ethnic foods, politics , history , libraries and following sports.

His survivors include his daughter Toby Lewis, M.D. and her husband Greg C. Lewis of Ann Arbor, Michigan a son Benjamin T. Lewis, who is a teacher and his wife Miwa T.
