LITTLETON — Edith M.T. (Morse)

Atkins, 88, a Littleton resident more than five decades who was active in church organizations in town as well as a choir singer, died Saturday, Aug. 31, at Life Care Center of Nashoba Valley in Littleton. She was married nearly 65 years to Harvey Atkins Sr., who died in 1999.

She was born in Cambridge on Dec. 15, 1913, daughter of the late Harry and Edith (Wright) Morse. She grew up in Cambridge and attended St. Paul's Elementary School.

After their marriage in 1935, Mr. and Mrs. Atkins spent vacations in Littleton and then they moved there in 1950. In earlier years she worked in Cambridge, first in the fountain at Kresge's in Central Square, and then at RCA during World War II.

Mrs. Atkins was very active in the Littleton Congregational Church, serving on many committees and was a member of the church choir. She also sang at the old Clubhouse in Littleton,
