LITTLETON — Bernard C. Araujo, 78, a Littleton resident who was a postal worker at a local post office and was a World War II veteran, died Wednesday, Nov. 9. He was the husband of Ellen (Veracka) Araujo to whom he was married for 19 years.

He was born in Onset, Jan. 17, 1927, son of the late Bernard and Mary (Vincent)

Araujo. He grew up in Onset and Fitchburg and graduated from Fitchburg High School in 1945.

He resided in Littleton for the past 19 years, where he was a member of St. Anne Church.

Mr. Araujo served in the Navy during World War II.


Before retiring in 1993, Mr. Araujo was a customer service representative at the Worcester Post Office. Previously, he
