## Evelyn 'Gram' Ogilvie ... was lifelong Littleton resident; 86

LITTLETON — Evelyn "Gram" (Green) Ogilvie, 86, a lifelong Littleton resident who had worked as an electronic assembler for several area companies, died Thursday, June 6, at Beth Israel Hospital West in Boston. She was the wife of Ralph L. Ogilvie, who died in 1990.

She was born in Littleton on Sept. 26, 1915, a daughter of the late Guy and Rachel (Ireland) Green. She attended Littleton schools and was married in 1936.
