

PASSED AWAY IN LITTLETON

Miss Lucy M. Adams Taught In Waltham For 35 Years

Miss Lucy M. Adams, sister of John H. Adams of West Concord and until her retirement about six years ago, for thirty-five years a valued teacher in the Waltham schools, died at her home in Littleton, Monday.

Miss Adams was born in Littleton, July 17, 1869, daughter of John Ware and Emily Kendall Porter Adams. She was graduated at the Littleton High school and Miss Ellen Kimball's School in Worcester and then entered the teaching profession and for thirty-five years was recognized as an outstanding teacher in the Waltham schools. She was an active member of Old Concord Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, and deeply interested in the highest ideals of the Society and the Nation. By her charm of personality, her sincere friendliness, and her genuine worth, she had won many friends.

The funeral was held this morning at the Unitarian church in Littleton with the minister, the Rev. William Channing Brown, conducting the services. Beautiful floral offerings told their own story of love and high regard, and the gathering of friends sang favorite hymns. The pall bearers were Harold Whitcomb, Oliver Whitcomb and Arthur Barker, of Littleton, and Kendall Adams of West Concord. Burial was in the Littleton cemetery.

She is survived by her sister, Miss Emily F. Adams, with whom she made her home, by her brother, John Henry Adams, prominent West Concord merchant, and by a number of nieces and nephews.
