


## Albert E. Pickard

### ...Littleton farmer, mail carrier; 84

LITTLETON — Albert E. Pickard, 84, a life-long Littleton resident where owned a dairy farm and also delivered mail in town, died Tuesday,

 Jan. 11, at the Lifecare Center of Nashoba Valley in Littleton. He was the husband of Mary (Condon)

Pickard, to whom he was married for 52 years.

He was born in Littleton on May 18, 1915, a son of the late William L. and Florence R. (Houghton) Pickard. He graduated from Littleton High School, Class of 1933 and the Bryant & Stratton Business School in Boston in 1935. He also took several courses at Cornell and Rutgers University related to cattle breeding.

At age 25, he enlisted in the Army during World War II and was honorably discharged as a captain. From 1946 to 1958 he was employed by the Massachusetts Selective Breeding Association in the capacity of head technician for implementing the selective cattle breeding program in Middlesex County. From 1958 to 1959, he was employed by the Division of Livestock Disease Control for the State Department of Agriculture of the Commonwealth.

In 1952, Mr. Picard purchased and operated a dairy farm at 155 Great Road, in Littleton. In 1961 he took the Rural Mail Carrier examination and delivered mail for the Postal Service until his retirement in the early 1980s.

In addition to his wife, Mr. Pickard is survived by four sons, David E., Charles H., and Daniel Pickard, all of Littleton, Albert A. Pickard of Townsend, two daughters, Mary Pickard of Ayer and Julie Pickard of Germany; seven grandchildren; one great-grandchild; and a sister, Mary Page Brown of Littleton.

He was also the brother of the late Winnifred Hartwell, Ashley Pickard, Hobart Pickard, Charles Pickard, Charlotte Lovejoy, Catherine Brown and Elizabeth Papen.
