Eileen married Richard S. Paskow in 1948. They had two children, Richard A. Paskow and Danielle E. Paskow (Thompson). Her surviving grandchildren are Jeremy & Matthew Paskow and Michael & Ian Thompson. Though most of her immediate family was scattered across the country, she was always involved in their lives, as "family was always the most important part of her life."

For the past 35 years she has been with her significant other, Angelo Giangregorio, who has been her best friend and companion. She was an important part of his life, his 5 boys and their families. John, James, Mark, Gary and Michael (now deceased) considered her as part of their family.
