Forrest K. Quebbeman, 76, of King St., died at Apple Valley Continuing Care Center in Ayer after a year of long illness.

He was born in New Salisbury, Indiana on Feb. 1, 1919, son of the late Clarence and Nettie (Bopp) Quebbeman. He spent his early life in new Salisbury and was a graduate of New Salisbury High School. Mr. Quebbeman attended Purdue University, Officers' Candidate School and subsequently served over 20 years in the U.S. Army retiring as Major in 1961. He served in various places such as Alaska, Europe, Japan, Hawaii, and finally Fort Devens in Ayer.

Mr. Quebbeman then worked for Paul R. Sturgeon, an electronics supplier, Digital Equipment Corp., in Maynard and retired from the U.S. Postal Service, Littleton office in 1980.

He was a dedicated member of the Sixteen Footers Square Dance Club, an activity both he and his wife Donna enjoyed. Mr. Quebbeman served two terms as President of the Club and also held the offices and responsibilities while an active Sixteen Footer.

Mr. Quebbeman is survived by his wife, Donna (Dadmun) Quebbeman of Littleton, a daughter, Karyn F. Horlor of Marlborough, a son, Gary O. Quebbeman of Boxborough, two brothers, Victor Quebbeman of New Salisbury, Indiana, and Donald Quebbeman of Pueblo, Colorado, two sisters Frances and Catherine Quebbeman both of New Salisbury, Indiana.
