SOUDERTON, Pa. — Edna Mae Robinson, 93, a former Littleton resident who was a Littleton High School teacher, died Friday, July 7, at the home of her daughter, Dorothy, while in hospice care.

She was the beloved wife of the late John N. Robinson.

She graduated from Salem Teacher's College. She spent most of her life in Littleton, where she was a high-school teacher heading the Business Education Department.

Her smile, words of encouragement, generosity and Christian example were precious gifts that live on; she will be greatly missed.
