Harry Rivetts

... of Littleton, had worked at San-Vel; 84

LITTLETON — Harry Rivetts, 84, died at Keystone Nursing Home in Leominster Monday, Sept. 24. He was the husband of Vertrice (Bowling) Rivetts, who died in 1974.



He was born in Littleton on Oct. 30, 1916, a son of the late James and Jenny (Landano) Rivetts. A lifelong resident of Littleton, he attended the Littleton Public School System.

As a youth he worked for Sheridan Acres farms and as a truck driver for Knox Brothers at Fort Devens. He drove concrete trucks for San-Vel Corp., in Littleton for most of his life and retired in 1986.

Mr. Rivetts served in the Army during World War II as a diesel mechanic.

He was a member of the Teamsters Union 170 in Worcester, and was a union steward at San-Vel. He was a member of the Veterans of Foreign War Post 6556 and the American Legion Post 249, both of Littleton. Mr. Rivetts was also a member of St. Anne Parish in Littleton.

He is survived by his brother, Ralph Rivetts of Leominster; and a sister Nellie Pacy of Acton.
