

DIED JAN. 5, 1921

Samuel Reed, one of the oldest residents of the town, passed away Wednesday evening about eight o'clock. He sustained a slight shock the night before Christmas and had been ailing continually since. He experienced another shock recently and from that time failed rapidly. His sons and their wives cared for him faithfully throughout his illness, and previously gave him every attention he would accept.

Mr. Reed was a veteran of the Civil war, and his death removes nearly the last of the men that Littleton furnished the cause. He enjoyed the esteem of his friends and fellow townsmen, and throughout his career enjoyed the reputation of a quiet, industrious and upright life.

From the residence of his son, Fred, on Great road, the funeral was held at two o'clock Friday afternoon, Rev. Gail Cleland officiating, and the interment was made at Westlawn where his wife was laid to rest two years ago her death having occurred on January 6, 1919.

Mr. Reed observed his eighty-ninth birthday the twelfth of last October. He is survived by his sons, Fred, George, Samuel and Lyman Reed, two daughters, Mrs. Mary Boynton and Mrs. Jennie Conrad, besides grandchildren and great grandchildren.
