Littleton — Michael L. Sokol, 65, of Littleton died at his residence on March 9, 2008. He was born in Lawrence, Mass on March 11, 1942 and was the son of the late Harry and Frances (Freedman) Sokol . He grew up in Methuen and was a graduate of Methuen High School, Class of 1959. Michael continued his education at the Northeast Institute of Industrial Technology where he studied in Machine Design, and the University Extension of Lincoln Institute where he also studied Electronic Lay - out and Design.

Mr. Sokol worked in many areas including designing and patenting the Holter portable EKG Monitoring Sys - tem as well as designed and patented a portable bat - tery operated cardiac monitor with American Optical Corporation in Bedford He then became program man - ager for Picker International Inc. In 1982 he became Vice President of Marketing and Sales for Pioneer Medical Systems which distributed a line of seventy five medical products. In 1984 he became Vice President of Operations for Bionet, Inc , a clinical testing service company .In the mid-80s Michael joined Kurzweil Com - puter Products/Xerox Imaging Systems to manage the day to day operations and sales of the Kurzweil Person - al Reader, the first mass marketed reading machine for the blind. He helped found Kurzweil Educational Sys - tems in the mid-90's to act as COO and later CEO of the company, which produced more affordable and power - ful reading systems for the blind and learning disabled. Mr. Sokol continued this work in his last years, joining KNFB Reading Technology, to help launch the latest Kurzweil Reading Machine technology. His affiliation with Ray Kurzweil and other spanned over twenty years and led to access to printed material for many thou - sands of individuals over the years.

He has made his home in Littleton for over 30 years and liked wookworking and had a passion for cars.

His survivors include his brother Allan Sokol and sister Ruth Sandler both of Boynton Beach, FL. and several nieces and nephews.. He was also the former husband of Sonja (Manni) Sokol of Salem, MA.
