Louise (Ferrari) Smith, 35 Foster St., Littleton, died Feb. 22 at Emerson Hospital after a brief illness.

She had been the office manager of the *Lowell Sun* Ayer bureau at 36 Main St., from the time the branch office opened on April 26, 1965 until her retirement, Dec. 27, 1980.

Prior to managing the Ayer office, she had worked for *The Sun* as a correspondent covering Littleton and other towns in the Nashoba Valley.

She was born in Boston, daughter of the late John and Katherine (O'Connor) Ferrari, and was the wife of the late Arthur F. Smith.

She spent her early years in Boston and graduated from Fitch High School. She was also a graduate of Fisher Business College.

She lived in Somerville before moving to Littleton 36 years ago.

She was a past president of the American Legion, Auxiliary Post 249, Littleton Senior Citizens Club, King's Daughters, Littleton Grange No. 420. She was also a member of the New England Quilters Guild, the Littleton Historical Society and was a communicant of St. Anne's Church in Littleton.

She is survived by a son, Arthur F. Smith Jr. of Montgomery, Alabama; two daughters, Mrs. William (Margot) Murphy of Albany, Georgia, and Mrs. David (Nancy) Bradbury of Littleton; and six grandchildren.
