Raymond E. Bradley, 90, of Pompano Beach, Fla., a columnist for the *Independent* in the 1950s, died Tuesday, Jan. 13, 1998, at his home. He was the husband of the late Josephine (Cirasano) Bradley.

Born in Littleton on June 29, 1907, he was the son of the late Herbert and Mable Bradley.

He was an Army veteran of World War II, serving with the 91st Infantry Division. He was a member of the Littleton Sportsman Club, and a charter member of the VFW Post 6556, and was a member of St. Anne's Catholic Church in Littleton. He was a retired weaver from United Elastic in Littleton and wrote a column about hunting and fishing for the *Independent*.
