
...of Littleton, was avid traveler, 22

LITTLETON — Jonathan Blackburn, a Concord native and former varsity golfer at Littleton High School, died unexpectedly Tuesday, May 21. He was 22.

He was born in Concord on April 8, 1980, a son of Thomas Blackburn of Concord, and Marion (White) Haupert, who resides in Littleton with her husband, Dr. Garner T. Haupert Jr. He graduated from Littleton Junior-Senior High School in 2000, where he lettered in varsity golf. He attended the Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts and Framingham State College as a sociology major.

Mr. Blackburn's love of geography, cultural studies and travel began early in his life. He had driven from Canada to Florida, taken an overnight train to Georgia and flown to the West Coast to visit Oregon. In high school, he enjoyed the opportunity to go with other students to Germany and the Alps. One of the highlights of his life was being at the Eiffel Tower in Paris for the Millennium celebration. He also enjoyed music, tennis, paintball and was an avid Red Sox fan.

In addition to his parents and stepfather, he is survived by two brothers, T.J. and Gregory Blackburn; a stepbrother, Mallory Haupert, all of Littleton; a stepsister, Sibylle Haupert of Portland, Ore; his grandparents, Jim and Rita Blackburn of Concord; a step-grandmother, Carroll Haupert of Medford, Ore.; his aunts and uncles, Christina and James Lister of Nashua, Jim and Margaret Blackburn of Scituate; and many cousins.
