Edgar L. Bibeault... Littleton, auto parts distributor, WWII Navy veteran; 79

LITTLETON — Edgar L. Bibeault, 79, died yesterday, May 23, at Life Care Center of Nashoba Valley in Littleton. He was the husband of Marcella (Thibeault) Bibeault, to whom he was married for 58 years.

 He was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., on Oct. 15, 1924, a son of the late Edgar C. and Estelle (Brassard) Bibeault. He was raised in Arlington and graduated from Arlington High School in 1943. He had lived in Littleton since 1955.

Mr. Bibeault served with the U.S. Navy during World War II as an aviation mechanics mate 2nd class. Later, he joined the Army National Guard, retiring in 1984 as a lieutenant colonel.

At one time, he commanded the 104th Ordnance Division at Fort Devens.

Mr. Bibeault worked in auto parts sales for Babson Saunders Distributor. In 1965, he founded Jobbers Warehouse in Somerville, an auto parts distributor, which he owned and operated until his retirement in 1995.

He belonged to St. Anne's Church in Littleton.

Mr. Bibeault was a member of the Littleton V.F.W. Post 6556, Tahattawan Masonic Lodge A.F. and A.M. of Littleton, The 100 Club and the National Rifle Association.

Besides his wife, he is survived by two sons, Edgar A. Bibeault of Reading and Steven Bibeault of Methuen; a sister, Rita Lyons of Rindge, N.H.; and two grandchildren, Scot and Kristin Bibeault.
