

## Theodore E. Tuttle

Theodore E. Tuttle, 68, of 3 Valley Drive, died Wednesday at Nashoba Community Hospital, Ayer, after a lengthy illness.

He was born in Walnut Cove, North Carolina, on Dec. 28, 1917, son of the late Riley and Agnes (Tuttle) Tuttle, and was the husband of the late Margaret (Christofono) Tuttle, who died last year.
