

Theodore 'Paul' Valcourt ...formerly of Littleton, WWII veteran; 81

CHARLESTOWN, N.H. — Theodore "Paul" Valcourt, 81, of Chase Circle and a former long-time resident of Littleton, Mass., died Monday, April 26, at Springfield Hospital in Springfield, Vt., 11 days after the death of his wife, Virginia Grace (Laushance) Valcourt.

He was born in Quebec on April 23, 1918, a son of the late Jean and Marie (Beulieu) Valcourt. Mr. Valcourt came to the United States in 1940 and resided in Westford's Forge Village. He married his wife in Oct. 30, 1957, and they lived in Littleton for 30 years before moving to Charlestown, N.H. in 1987.

He was a Navy veteran of World War II.

Mr. Valcourt worked at San-Vel Concrete/Lone Star industries as a production worker and foreman for the 28 years, retiring in 1983. Mrs. Valcourt had been a child care provider in Littleton for 20 years.

He was a member of the Charlestown, N.H. VFW. Post #8947, and the Ayer Sportsman Club. He was a former member of St. Anne's Church in Littleton.

His survivors include four daughters, Carol Ann and her husband George Ashline of Hartland, Vt., Linda and her husband Sheldon Grant of Littleton, Marie and her husband Thomas Short of Townsend, Mass., and Roseanne Chapin of Hartford, Vt; four sons, Gordon N. Ploof and Bruce Ploof, both of Claremont, N.H., Theodore "Ted" Valcourt of Ayer and James "Jim" Valcourt of Unity, N.H.; a brother, Eugene and his wife Adrienne Valcourt of Westford; a sister, Carmen and her husband Clifford Robinson of Lowell; 11 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren; also, several nieces, nephews and cousins.
