LITTLETON — Walter C. Wright, 90, died Tuesday, Feb. 22, 2005, at Nashoba Valley Medical Center. He was the husband of Ellen (Peterson) Wright.

He was born in Littleton on Aug. 12, 1914, the son of the late Charles and Ethel (Capen) Wright. A lifelong resident of Littleton, Mr. Wright graduated from Littleton High School in 1930, and was the oldest living graduate of the class. He graduated from Bentley College with a degree in accounting in 1966.

Mr. Wright was employed at United Elastics, a division of J.P. Stevens Co. in Littleton for
