TOWNSHEND — Elizabeth W. "Betty" Wyman, 93, of Townshend and Newfane Hill, died Tuesday afternoon, Nov. 2, at Stratton House, where she had been a resident for seven years.

Before moving to Townshend in September 1992, she had lived in Scituate, Mass.

One of three children, she was born Jan. 15, 1906, in Lawrence, Kan., a daughter of Arthur and Elizabeth (Stone) Walker. She attended area schools in Lawrence, and earned a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Kansas.

She was a member of Kappa Alpha Theta, receiving her 75-year pin last year, the Unity Club and Alliance Club at Scituate Unitarian Church. Of her many interests, she enjoyed bird watching, traveling and being involved in church activities.

In 1929, she married Andrews Wyman of Waban, Mass., who died in 1961.

When Mrs. Wyman moved to Scituate, she became involved in working on the family farm and took pleasure in raising her family.

She is survived by a son, Bruce Wyman of Media, Pa.; two daughters, Nancy Crafts of Scituate, and Peggy Goldyn of Williamsville; nine grandchildren; and 13 great-grandchildren.

She was predeceased by a brother, Arthur T. Walker Jr., and a sister, Margaret Cool.

Private graveside services will be held at the family plot in Littleton, Mass.
