Timothy E. Wargo ... Littleton EMT, firefighter, active at Harvard church; 42

LITTLETON — Timothy E. Wargo, 42, an emergency medical technician and volunteer firefighter in town, died Friday,

 Nov. 1, of smoke inhalation from a fire at his home in Littleton.

He was the husband of Stacy (Adams) Wargo, to whom he was married for four years.

He was born in McKeesport, Pa., on Aug. 17, 1960, a son of Edward and Rita (Mehalik) Wargo of Harvard. He attended school in Puerto Rico and graduated from high school

in 1979 at Harvard's Bromfield School.

Mr. Wargo worked in shipping and receiving for various companies, including the Pepsi plant in Ayer. He also worked as an EMT and served as a volunteer firefighter in Littleton for the past seven years.

He was a member of St. Theresa's Church in Harvard, where he was a Eucharistic minister, lector, and reader.

Besides his parents and wife, survivors include a brother, Adrian M. Wargo of Old Hickory, Tenn.
