Robert J. White...former longtime Littleton resident, WWII veteran; 79

 **YARMOUTH** — Robert J. White, 79, a former longtime Littleton resident who was a World War II veteran and worked many years at a library in town, died Tuesday, Feb. 10, at the Life Care Center of Nashoba Valley in Littleton. He was the husband of Beverley (Sawyer) White, to whom he was married for 50 years.

He was born in Amherst, Nova Scotia, on Sept. 1, 1924, son of the late Frederick and Vera (Taylor) LeBlanc. He was raised in Littleton, where he attended local schools. Mr. White served in the Army during World War II.

He worked as a leather splitter for many years, including the Hartnett Tannery in Ayer, and the Victory Tannery in Peabody,

where he retired from in 1987. Mr. White had also been the custodian for 25 years at the Reuben Hoar Library in Littleton.

He and his wife retired to Yarmouth, and have lived in the Cape Cod town's South Yarmouth section since 1987.

Mr. White was a member of the Littleton Congregational Church in Littleton, and the Pilgrim Church in Harwichport on Cape Cod.

He had a talent for woodworking, carpentry and rebuilding cars.
