Raymond E. Wilcox Jr. ...Littleton resident; 83

LITTLETON — Raymond E. "Red" Wilcox Jr., 83, a long-time Littleton resident who was a former owner of a service station in town and later helped build area homes and repaired antique clocks, died Tuesday, Nov. 7, at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in Boston. He was married for 59 years to Florence (Foley) Wilcox, who died in September.

He was born in Littleton, son of the late Raymond and Mildred (Schwartz) Wilcox. He graduated from Littleton High School.

After working for a few years at Nashoba Garage, Mr. Wilcox purchased the Citgo Service Station at Littleton Common. He operated the business for many years before selling it to Frank Edwards.

Mr. Wilcox then began a career in woodworking, helping his brother construct houses. He also completed many woodworking projects for three decades. He later started repairing antique clocks, and was a member of the Antique Clock association.

He is survived by a son and his wife, Donald and Suzanne Wilcox of Hudson, N.H.; a daughter, Linda Marie Zanchi of Hudson, N.H. He also leaves five grandchildren, James S. Zanchi, Kristina Richardson, Kathleen Zanchi, Chelsey Wilcox, and Courtney Wilcox; as well as five great-grandchildren.

His brother, Frank E. Wilcox, died earlier this week.
