

Hans Wolfgang Zieler, authority in microscopy

Services were held Tuesday for Hans Wolfgang Zieler, 75, of 901 Village rd. East, Norwood. Mr. Zieler, a noted microscopist, died Feb. 9 in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

He was born in Berlin and came to this country in 1924. From 1924 to 1945 he worked for the E. Leitz, Inc., New York, serving as president from 1935 to 1945. In 1956 he founded his own company, Zieler

Instrument Co. and in 1968 the business was merged with Atlantex Instrument Co. At the time of his death, he was vice president of Atlantex and Zieler Instrument Corp. (AZI) in Dedham.

He frequently lectured at Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute, New York University, University of Chicago, University of Illinois, Massachusetts Institute of Technology and Northeastern University.

He was a fellow and life member of the New York Microscopical Society and was its president from 1939 to 1940.

Besides his wife, Loretta (Rice), he leaves two daughters, Mrs. Nancy Hilsinger of Littleton and Mrs. Ellen Neave of Melrose.
