

# Elaine Batting...Latin teacher

Elaine (Gould) Batting, 47, of King Street, Littleton, formerly of Malden, died unexpectedly at the Lahey Clinic in Burlington on Aug. 18, 1994.

She was born in Jay, Maine on July 30, 1947, daughter of the late Luman and Yvette (Soucy) Gould. She spent her early life in Pittsfield, Maine and was a graduate of Maine Central Institute in 1965. She then graduated from the University of Maine in Orono in 1969, cum laude, with a bachelor's degree in Latin. She received her master's degree in education from Tufts University in 1982.

After her marriage in 1969, Mrs. Batting had made her home in Malden for 20 years and most recently in Littleton since 1990. She had been a substitute teacher of English at Beebe High School in Malden from 1977-78, an English Department intern at Medford High School from 1980-1982, and a part-time Latin teacher at Stoneham High School in Stoneham from 1982-1984.

Most recently Mrs. Batting had been chairperson of the Language Department and Latin teacher at Archbishop Williams High School in Braintree from 1984 until the present.

Mrs. Batting was a member of the Classical Association of Massachusetts, the American Classical League, Elementary Teachers of Classics, the Massachusetts Foreign Language Associations, Classical Association of New England, and the National Association of Student Activity Advisors.

Her survivors include her former husband Dann Batting of Sherbourne; a son, Brett C. Batting of Malden; two daughters, Karen L. Batting of Malden and Bridget S. Batting of Littleton; a brother, Richard V. Gould of Durham, Maine; and two sisters, Carol A. Gould of South Paris, Maine and Joan E. Nagle of Portland, Maine.

Funeral services will be private and burial will be in Westlawn Cemetery, Littleton.
