Henry V. Couper, 82, of Littleton, died Wednesday, Sept. 30, 1998.

Born in Littleton, he was the son of the late Henry and Jennie (Kimball) Couper. In 1934, he graduated from Littleton High School as Class Salutatorian. In 1938 he graduated from the Massachusetts State Agricultural College (University of Massachusetts). He completed his graduate work in entomology and geology at Virginia Polytechnical Institute in Blacksburg, Va.

Mr. Couper is known for authoring 12 pamphlets called "Memories from the Snake Pit" about life and experiences in Littleton. These were published for the benefit of the Reuben Hoar Library.

Mr. Couper is also known for his many gifts to area charities. His charitable trust will continue his philanthropy.

He is survived by a brother, Dean H. Couper of Kensington, Md.; a niece, Barbara O'Connell of Maine; Frank Couper of Maryland and numerous cousins.
