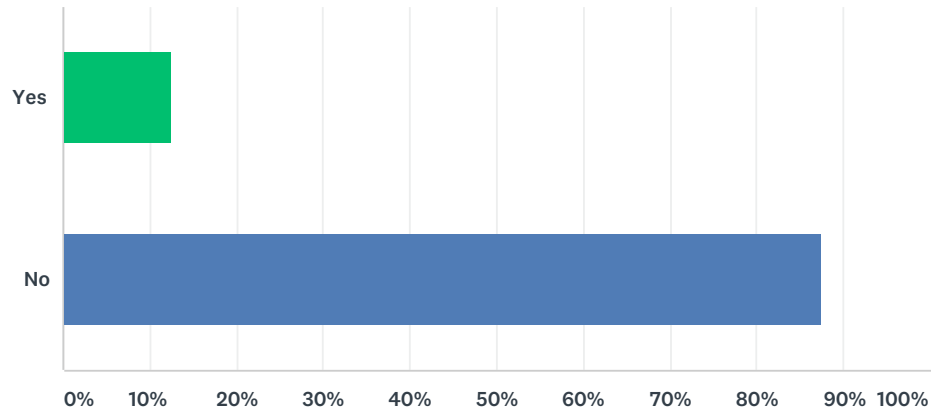


Q1 Did you attend one of the Littleton Station Village visioning session meetings in April?

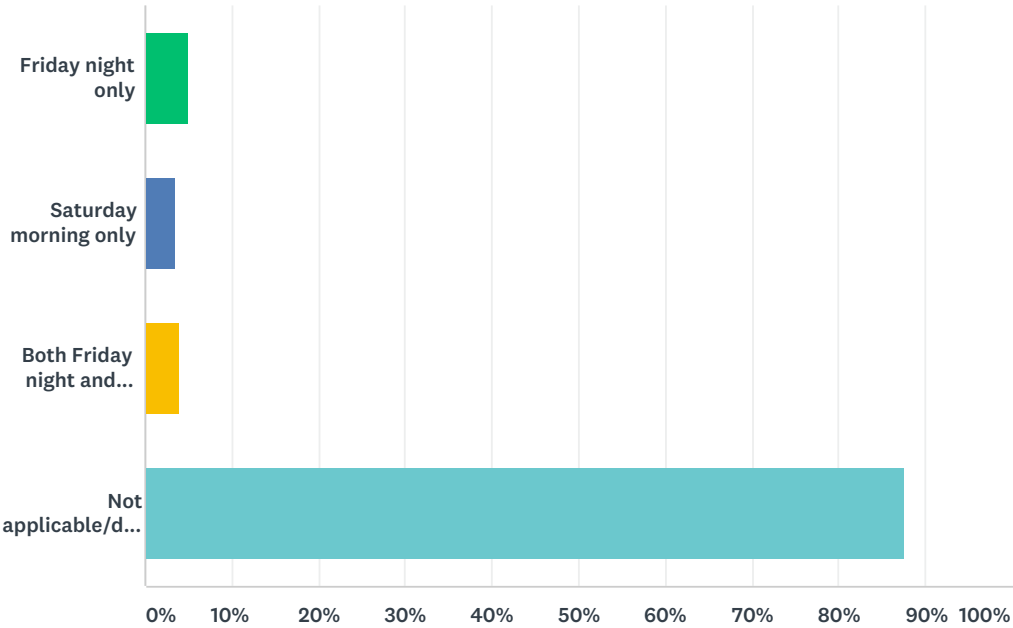

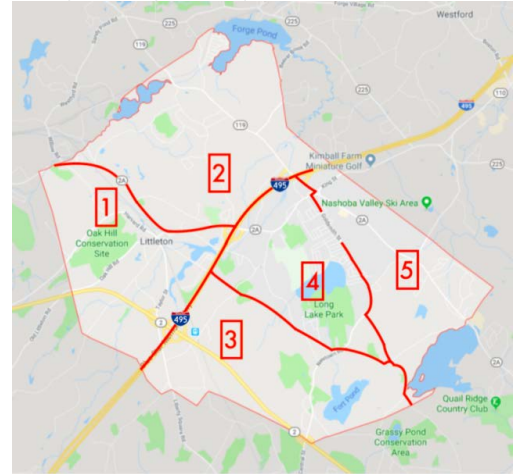
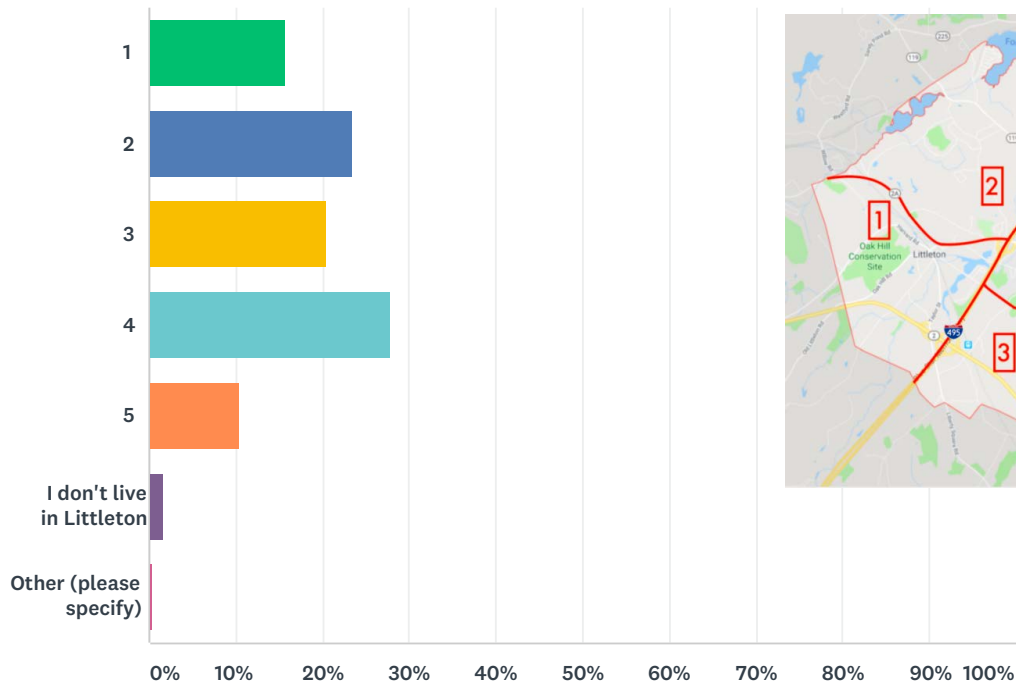

Q3 Where do you live? Please look at the map and select the number that includes your residence. The boundaries of the numbered areas are the major roads shown in a thick red line.

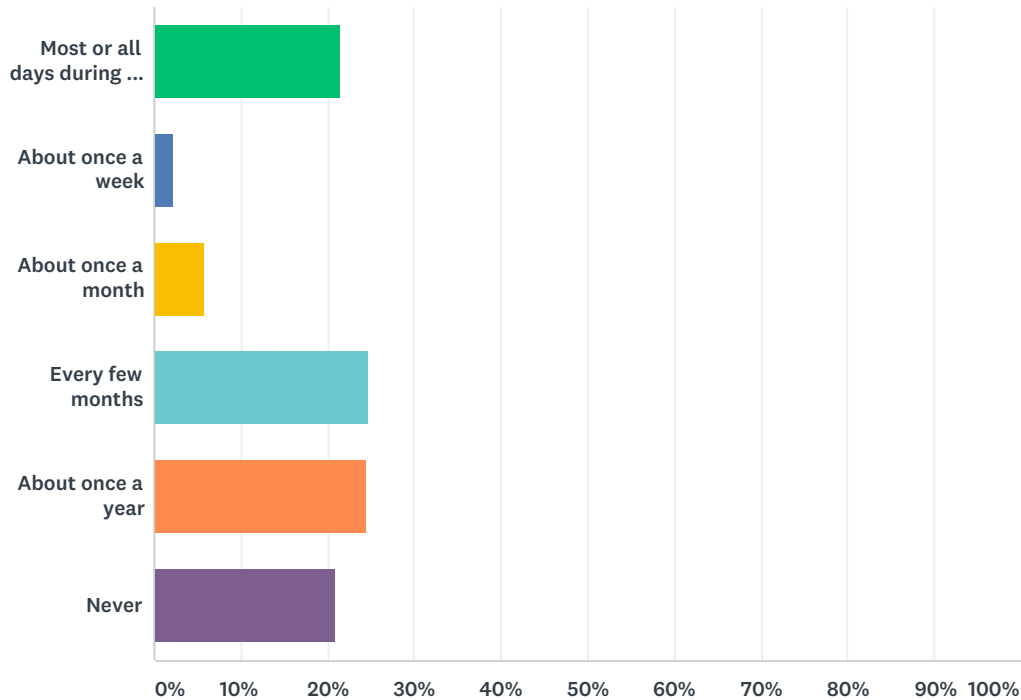

Q4 How often do you take the MBTA Commuter Rail to Boston or another destination on the Fitchburg Line?

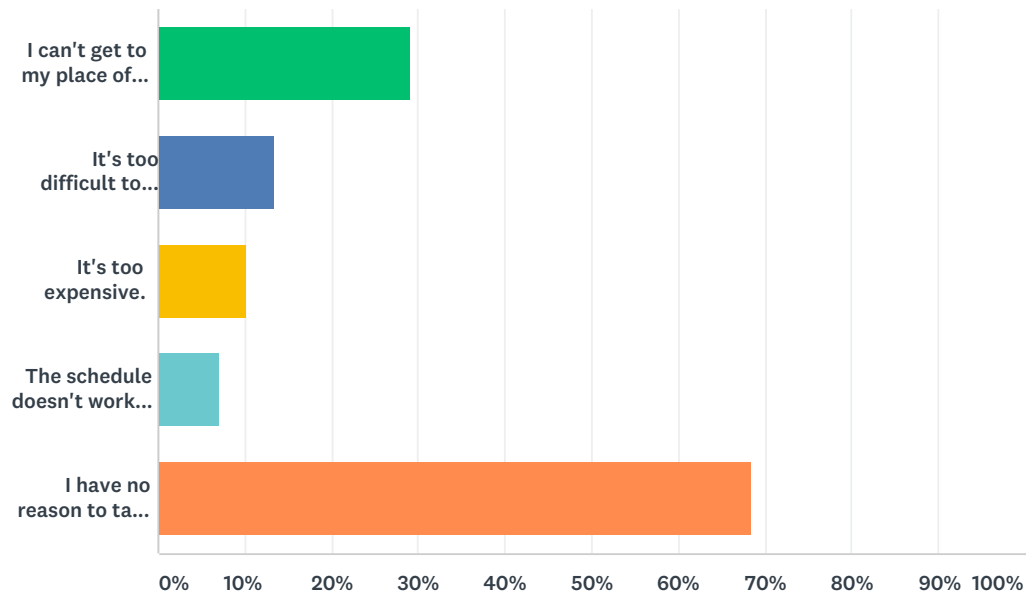

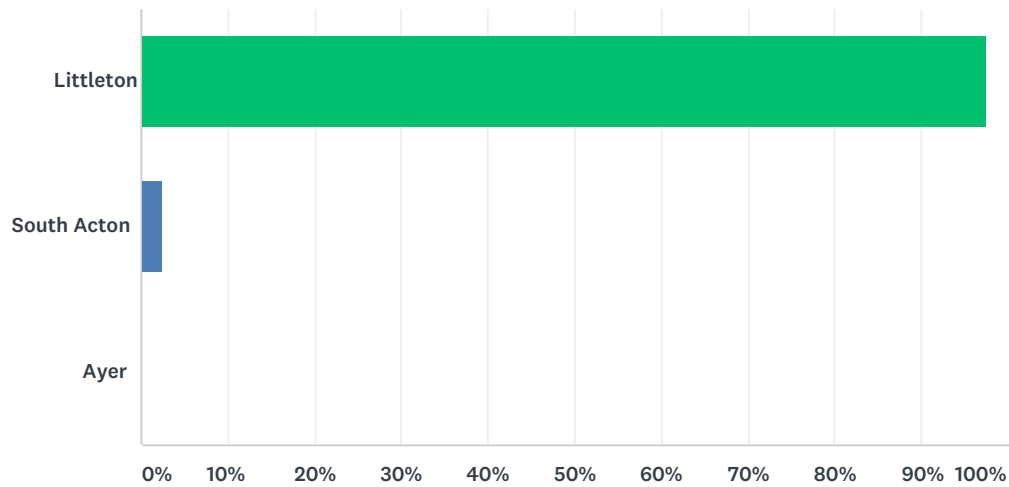

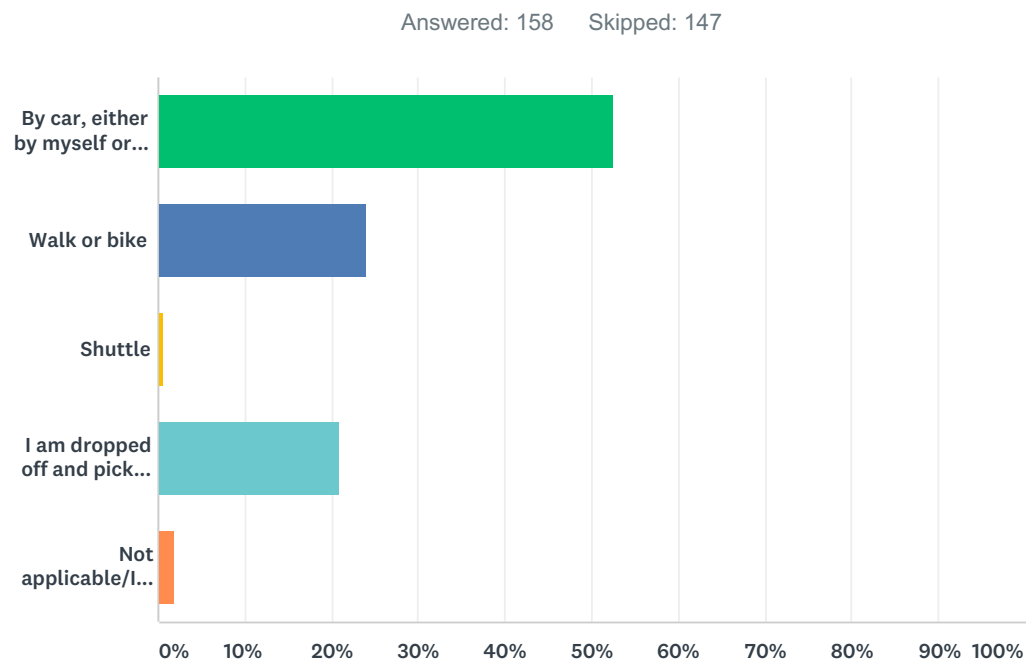
Q6 When you take the train, do you board in Littleton or at another station?

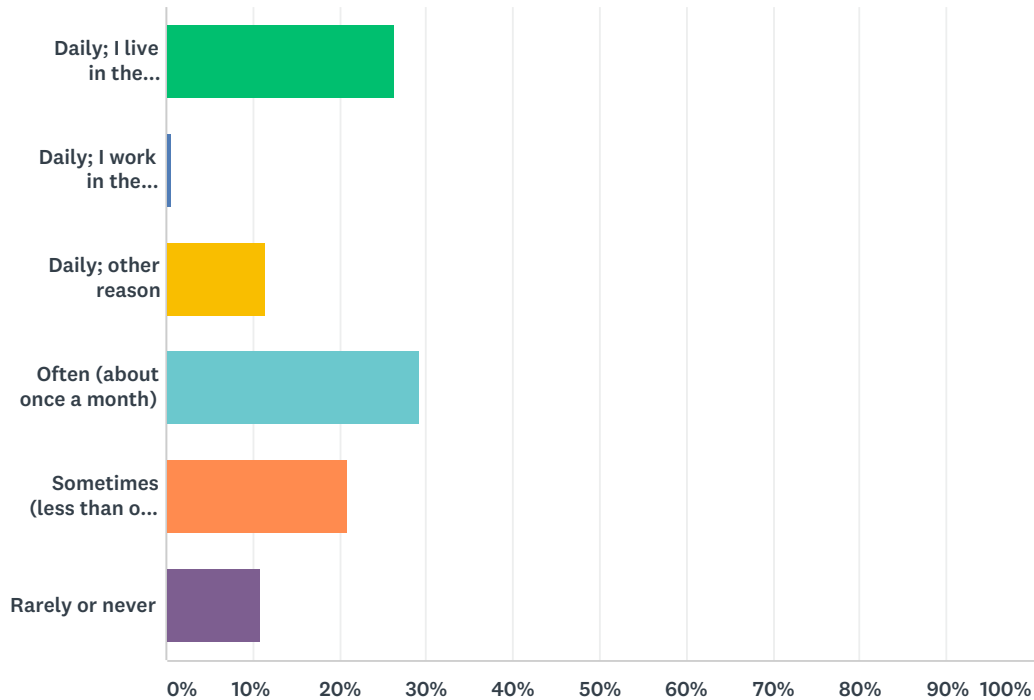
Q7 If you board in Littleton, how do you get to the train station?

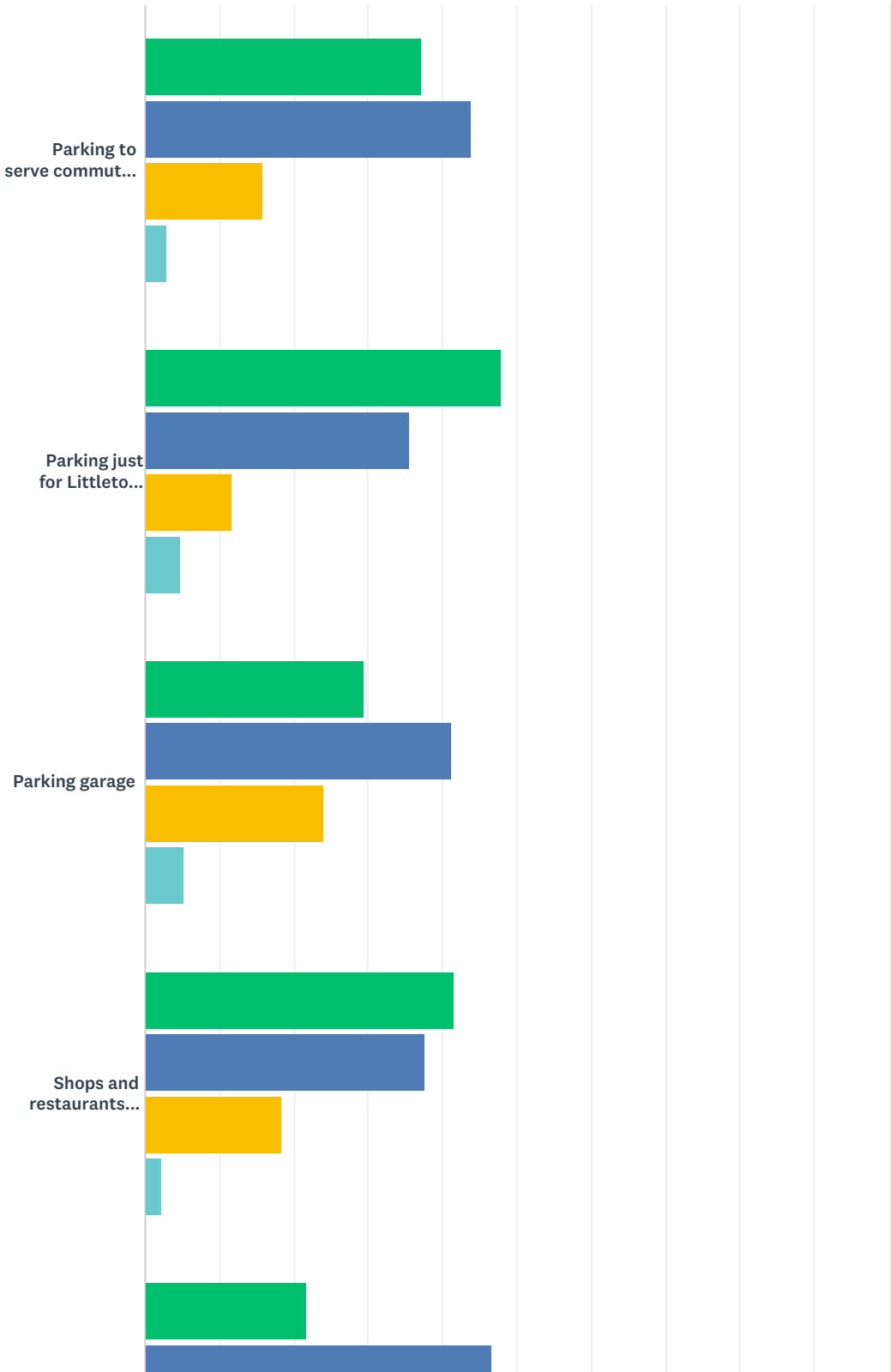

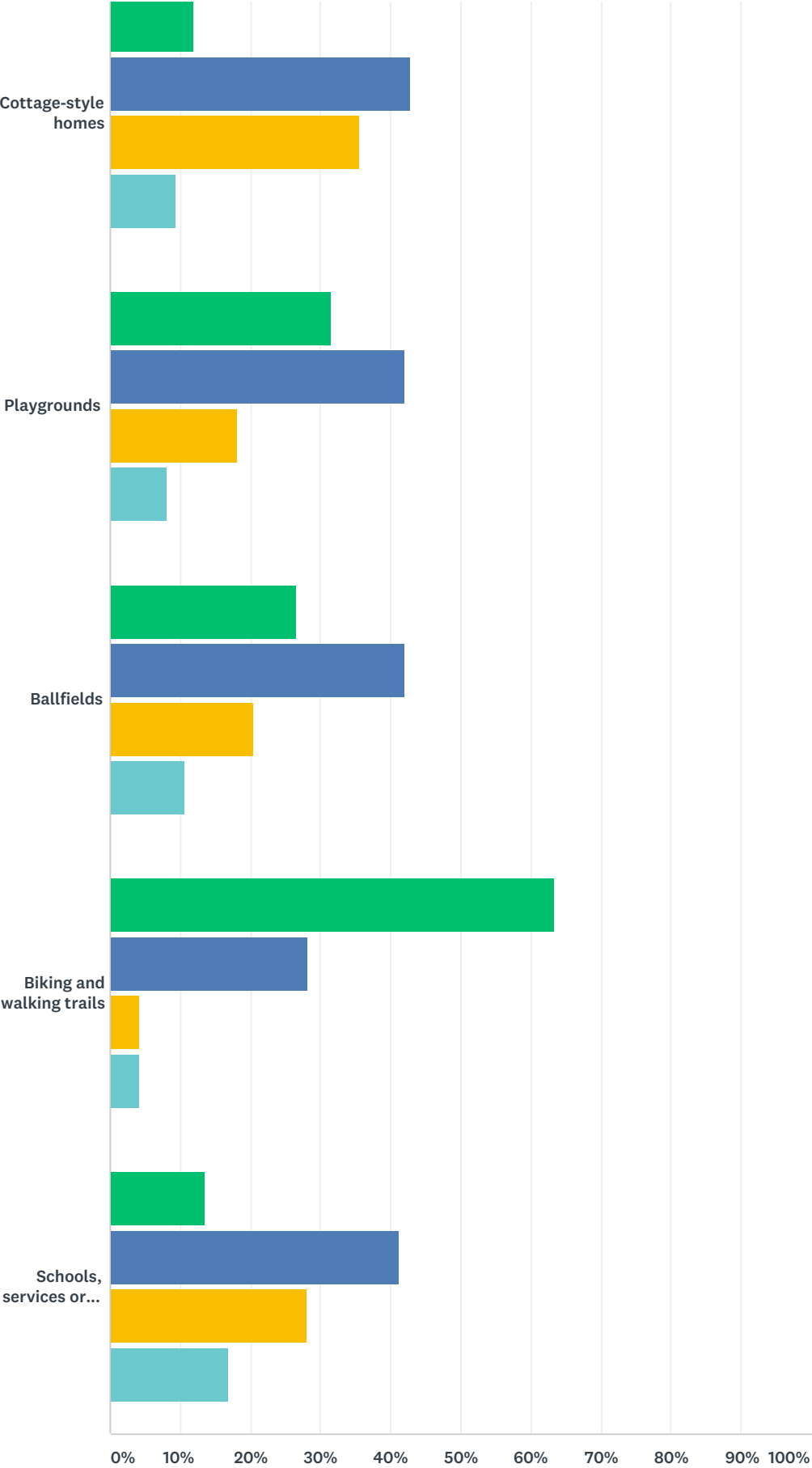

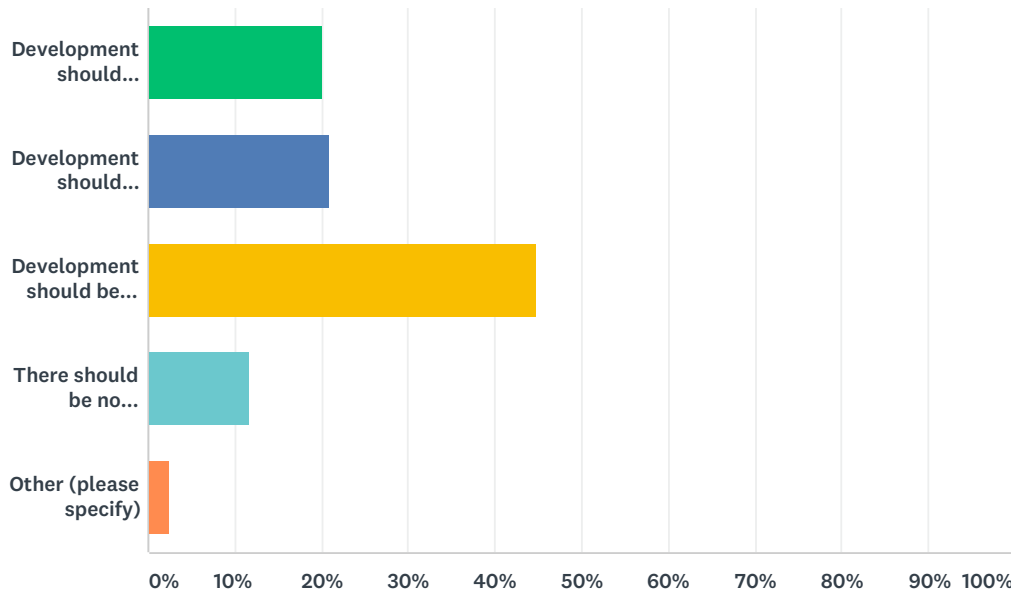
