

## John B. Clyde... of Littleton, surveyor for Army Corps, Korean War vet; 74

LITTLETON — John B. Clyde, 74, a long-time resident of Littleton who was a Korean War veteran, died Thursday, Nov. 30, at his residence. He was the husband of Gioia (Smith) Clyde, to whom he was married for 40 years.

He was born in Boston, April 19, 1932, son of the late James and Elizabeth (Pepper) Clyde. He grew up in Lexington, and graduated from Lexington High School in 1950.

He was a resident of Littleton since 1966.

Mr. Clyde served in the Army, as a corporal, during the Korean War.

Before retiring in 1987, Mr. Clyde worked

most of his life as a surveyor for the Army Corps of Engineers in New England.

Besides his wife, he is survived by two sons and daughters-in-law, James and Sandra Clyde of Littleton, and Michael and Sherrie Clyde of Holliston; a daughter and son-in-law, Susan and David Crosier of Newbury Park, Calif.; his grandchildren, Lauren (Crosier) Najjarpour, Daniel Crosier, James Clyde Jr., George Clyde, Jackson Clyde and Riley Clyde; a sister, Helen Lee of Lexington; and a cousin, Jean Bradbury of Marlboro.
