...nurse; had owned Chase Farms in Littleton; 89

LITTLETON — Grace (Ames) Chase, 89, a longtime operating room nurse and co-owner of Chase Farms and Cider Mill in Littleton, died Monday, Oct. 20, at her home.

She was the wife of Lyman M. Chase, who died in 1993.

She was born in Hartford, Conn., on Dec. 7, 1913, daughter of the late Walter and Lilla (Kingsbury) Ames.

She grew up in Saugus and graduated from Saugus High School and Deaconess Hospital Nursing School. In 1936, she moved to Littleton with her husband, whom she married that same year.

Mrs. Chase was an operating room nurse at Emerson Hospital in Concord for many years. She also co-owned and operated Chase Farms and Cider Mill with her husband.

She was an active member of the Daughters of the American Revolution, the Mayflower Pact Society and was a Girl Scout leader. She was also a life deaconess of the First Baptist Church in Littleton.

She is survived by two daughters, Linda J. Chase of Littleton and Betty Sawyer of Venice, Fla.; also three grandchildren and many nieces and nephews.
