

MRS. MARGARET HUNTER CHAPPLE

Many relatives and friends were deeply sorrowed by the death of Mrs. Margaret Hunter Chapple, wife of Thomas Chapple, formerly of Littleton, but now residing at Concord Junction. She is survived by her husband and six children; also, her mother, Mrs. Martha Hunter, and three brothers, John and George of St. John and Fred of Stow; also, three sisters, Mrs. Elizabeth Stevenson of Stow, Mrs. Clarence Shaw of Concord Junction and Mrs. Dennis Eldridge of Hudson.

The remains were brought to Littleton and funeral services were held on Monday at two o'clock at the home of Mr. Chapple's sister, Mrs. F. C. Reed, Mr. Thompson officiating. The bearers were Mr. Shaw of Concord Junction, Mr. Eldridge of Hudson, James Chapple and H. J. Sauler of this town.
