John S. Carlson

...resident of Littleton, World War II veteran; 86

LITTLETON — John S. Carlson, 86, a resident of Littleton who was a World War II veteran, died Friday, Oct. 6, at Edith Nourse Memorial Veterans Hospital in Bedford.



He was the husband of Rose (Schuh) Carlson, whom he married in 1948.

He was born in Gardner, July 7, 1920, son of the late John Edward and Hilda (Kuniholm) Carlson. He grew up in Gardner and graduated from Gardner High School in 1938.

Mr. Carlson worked with his father at Gardner Doll and Carriage for a brief time and later attended a two-year college.

Mr. Carlson served in the U.S. Navy Seabees during World War II, at the rank of machinist mate 2nd class.

Mr. Carlson worked for various tool and die machine companies including F.H. Robinson, Zagar Inc. and before retiring at Isoreg, Inc. in Littleton, as a machinist and foreman. Previously, he worked in sales for several years.

He was a member of the Littleton VFW Post.

Besides his wife, he is survived by a two sons, Erik Carlson of West Townsend, and Robert Carlson of Lexington; two daughters, Martha Carlson-Bradley of Hillsboro, N.H., and Sara Griffin of Ayer; seven grandchildren; a brother, E. Thor Carlson of Newport, N.H.

He was also the brother of the late Norman and Herman Carlson, and Ruth Meyerhoff.
