I am about to move into this neighborhood with my husband and one year old son. Though I don't live here yet, I have spent a lot of time helping to build my future home, and the air often smells like marijuana. I am very concerned about raising my son in a neighborhood where playing outside means he will be smelling the marijuana in the air and being affected by its unknown medical implications. I would like to be able to spend time outside with my family and not have to smell marijuana or worry about the health of my child and my family. I also worry about what effects the particles in the air could have on future pregnancies. Even if the fumes technically fall within the EPA limits, which I'm not sure if they do, it is really unpleasant to live somewhere that often smells like weed. I am therefore opposed to the renewal of the Sanctuary Medicinals permits and their proposed addition.

Should this renewal/addition be approved to move forward, I would like to know:

- What steps are Sanctuary Medicinals taking to mitigate the fumes and particle levels of marijuana in the air?
- Do the particle levels in the fumes fall within the EPA limits?
- What are the medical implications of the particles in the air? Is it known?
