Natalie Curran dies

Natalie (Jones) Curran, 62, of 5 Mill Lane, Littleton, died Dec. 23 at her residence after a brief illness. She was born in Cambridge Dec. 13, 1924, daughter of the late Robert and Lois (Bateman) Jones. Mrs. Curran spent her early life in West Medford and Brookline, and moved to Littleton in 1959.

She was the children's librarian at the Reuben Hoar Library for the past 17 years and was to retire this month. She had been very active as a Girl Scout leader, PTA member, and Sunday School teacher. She was also active in the Garden Club, Littleton Lyceum, Littleton Historical Society, and the League of Women Voters.

Recently Mrs. Curran was honored as one of 25 Outstanding Citizens by the COMFED Savings Bank for volunteering

her time to many local organizations.

Mrs. Curran was also a Mayflower descendant.

She is survived by her husband, George B. Curran of Littleton; a son, Frederic Curran of Smithtown, New York; a daughter, Andrea Curran of Littleton; and two sisters, Eleanor McCormick of New Market, New Hampshire, and Sylvia Seidenberg of Needham.

A memorial service was held Sunday at the Congregational Church in Littleton with Reverend William Beldan officiating.
