

Irving Dunn... longtime resident

Irving T. Dunn, 80, of Littleton and South Yarmouth, died Monday, Nov. 28, 1994 at Mayflower Place Nursing Center, West Yarmouth, Mass., due to complications related to Parkinson's Disease.

Mr. Dunn was born in Belmont and was a graduate of Acton High School, class of 1933. He was raised in Acton and after marrying in 1938, settled in Littleton. He spent summers on Cape Cod.

He worked at several automotive shops in the Littleton area before purchasing Littleton Motors in 1944. He operated the dealership for over 35 years, retiring as president of the company in 1979. He owned and operated the Littleton Motors school bus business for over 34 years. He spent his retirement in South Yarmouth.

Mr. Dunn was founding president of the Littleton Lions Club and past master and member of the AF & AM Tahattawan Lodge in Littleton. He was a member of Aleppo Shrine Temple in Wilmington and he spent 25 years serving Littleton on various committees including the Finance Committee and the Light and Water Commissioners.

Mr. Dunn was a former Deacon of the First Congregational Church of Littleton and he was also a member of the Bass River & Blue Rock Country Clubs of South Yarmouth and the South Yarmouth Men's Club. He was an avid boater and also an avid bridge player with Harvard Men's Club of Harvard.

Survivors include his wife, Virginia M. (Locke) Dunn of Littleton and South Yarmouth; three sons, Jon I. Dunn, and his wife Susan (Faughman) of Littleton, Peter T. Dunn and his wife Laura (Emerson) of Oakland, Calif., and Barry W. Dunn and his wife Gail (Marino) of South Yarmouth; mother-in-law, Hortense B. Locke, of Concord; and grandchildren, Kyla E. Dunn of San Francisco, Calif., Nathan P. Dunn, of Oakland, Calif., Peter M. Dunn and Michael W. Dunn both of Littleton, and sister Dorothy Smith of West Acton.
