...Littleton resident since 1952; at 79

 LITTLETON — John L. Duffy, 79, a resident of Littleton nearly five decades, died yesterday, Jan. 16, at Life Care Center of Nashoba Valley in Littleton. He was the husband of Genevieve (Findle) Duffy, to whom he was married for 54 years.

He was born in Boston on June 14, 1921, a son of the late Patrick and Margaret (Leonard) Duffy. He grew up in Boston's Roxbury section and graduated Roxbury Memorial High School in 1939.

Mr. Duffy served in the Army during World War II. He worked as a department head for Hersey Water Meters in South Boston for 40 years, retiring in 1986.

He continued to live in Boston, making his home in Dorchester until moving to Littleton in 1952. He resided on Russell Street.


He was a member of the Littleton Westford Elks, The Nabnassett Country Club and St. Anne's Church in Littleton.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by a sister, Anna Cox of Dorchester; as well as three nephews and a niece.
