Elizabeth A. "Betty" (Spang) McCarthy of Littleton, Massachusetts, passed away peacefully with family by her side on Thursday, May 18, 2023. Betty was born to Philip and Alice (Higgins) Spang on June 12, 1927. She grew up in West Roxbury and attended Holy Name School and Holy Trinity High School, followed by training at Katherine Gibbs School. Upon graduation, she worked for several years at the Jordan Marsh corporate offices in Boston.
