

# Richard Eskeland /0/31 ... veteran of the Korean conflict

Richard K. Eskeland, 60, of 267 King St., Littleton, died suddenly on Oct. 31, 1993 at the University of Massachusetts Medical Center in Worcester.

He was born in Fall River on March 26, 1933, the son of the late John and Helvig (Olson) Eskeland. He spent his early life in Brooklyn, N.Y. and was a graduate of Brooklyn Technical High School.

Mr. Eskeland received his bachelor's degree from Fairleigh Dickinson College in electrical engineering. He served in the U.S. Navy during the Korean conflict.

Mr. Eskeland had worked in sales for General Radio for 15 years and later computer peripherals. In 1993 he received his degree in technical writing from Middlesex Community College and was working as a technical writer for Versyss, Inc. of Westwood.

Mr. Eskeland was a 32nd degree Mason with the Rising Sun

Lodge #39, A.F. & A.M. in Nashua, N.H. and a member of the Scottish Rite and a Shriner with the Bektash Temple of Concord, N.H. He was also a member of the Sons of Norway and I.E.E.E.

His survivors include his wife Barbara (Seger) Eskeland of Littleton, three sons and daughters-in-law, Eric and Debra Eskeland of Nashua, N.H., David and Janis Eskeland of Concord, N.H., and Christopher and Patricia Eskeland of Brookside, N.J.; one daughter and son-in-law, Jennifer and Gene Shutin of Milford, N.H.; a sister, Doris Broderick of Douglaston, N.Y.; and nine grandchildren.
