Donald P. Ellis

...of Littleton, World War II Navy veteran; 74

LITTLETON — Donald P. Ellis, 74, a World War II veteran and former aircraft mechanic, died unexpectedly yesterday, May 27, at his home in Littleton. He was the husband of



Evelyn (Campbell) Ellis.

He was born in Boston's Jamaica Plain, on Sept. 22, 1927, a son of the late Reynold and Emma (Peterson) Ellis. He grew up in Wayland and graduated from Wayland High School. During World War II he served as a seaman first class in the U.S. Navy.

After his military service, Mr. Ellis graduated from East Coast Aerotechnical School and became an aircraft mechanic at Capital Airlines in Washington. In 1952, he began working for United Airlines, and retired in 1982 after 30 years of service.

He also worked at the Concord Auto Auction, and at Cider Mill Products for several years.

Mr. Ellis attended the Littleton Congregational Church, and was a member of the Tahattawan Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Littleton, the Valley of Lowell Scottish Rite and the Temple Guard Unit of the Aleppo Shrine. His hobbies included gardening and craft painting.

Besides his wife, survivors include three sons, Charles Ellis of Littleton, Glen Ellis of Methuen and Carl Ellis of Leominster; a daughter, Dorothy Fowle of Ayer; a sister, Marjorie J. Ellis of Littleton; also 11 grandchildren.
