H. Flint Furbush

Former fire chief

H. Flint Furbush of 100 Foster Street, died after a short illness on August 15, 1984. He was born in Boxboro, Mass., August 9, 1895, son of the late William and Emily (Augusta) Furbush, and husband of the late Jennie L. (Tuttle) Furbush.

He attended the Boxboro school system and the Concord school system. He entered the U.S. Army on July 13, 1918, and was a Pvt. 1st Class. In the army, he performed various duties.

Furbush lived in Boxboro for twenty years, moving to Littleton upon his marriage. He worked as a chicken farmer until he became fire chief for many years. He was a member of the American Legion, and a former member of the Littleton Grange.

He is survived by three brothers, Luther B. of Littleton, Arthur H. of Boxboro, and Fred of Southbridge.

Besides his brothers, he also leaves several nieces and nephews.

His funeral was held on Friday, Aug. 17 at the Badger Funeral Home with the Rev. William Beldan officiating. Interment was in Westlawn Cemetery.
