Good Morning Maren,

At the BPAC meeting last night we reviewed the subdivision going in at 95 Taylor Street, which we know is up for discussion at tomorrow's Planning Board meeting. We passed a motion to initiate a conversation with the Planning Board about the subdivision bylaw on sidewalks. But we had a few questions that we are hoping you can answer. Since this is only a three unit subdivision and the road in there would be primarily used by residents we were wondering if either of these were a possibility?

- 1) As an alternative to improving existing sidewalk and/or adding sidewalk to the subdivision, the sidewalk on Taylor St. could be extended towards Rt. 2 - there is about a half-mile gap between the end of the sidewalk, and where it resumes on the south side of the Taylor St. / Rt. 2 interchange.
- 2) Alternatively, the town may consider having the developer contribute an appropriate amount of funds towards projects on the bicycle and pedestrian master plan.
